
1/14/19 KBA General Meeting

Great turnout! 35 Members in addition to the board attended the meeting.

Communications Committee report by Brian Fisher: Power Point presentation previously given to Tours and Stakeholders group. Some highlights:

- 1 year ago KBA had 1000 followers on Facebook (FB), website, 92 email addresses
- Today the website has been redesigned and optimized for mobile with a focus on tourism and local visitors. A greater focus is in place by Kim Riley on social media through FB and a new Instagram account starting Sept. 2018, promoting pillar and member events. Email outreach was moved to the platform of Constant Contact.
- The KBA has grown email contacts from 92 to over 600 this year, making mobilization for events easier.
- Open and click rate on emails avg 42-50% (industry avg. 20%) adding click forward on emails, linking to local businesses, all measured.
- The KBA is moving toward digital for sign ups for events and membership to cut down on admin work
- Social Media- Through promotion and frequent activity managed by Kim Riley social media grew from 1074 followers to 2541 followers. Original posts and shared business posts, upwards of 200 posts per week.
- Instagram starting Sept. 2018 is growing with 600+ followers, posts centered on what's going on around town.
- Web revamped to be easier to navigate, less click through for content. The goal is to promote events well in advance.
- Visit Kelseyville Website is now the 2nd listing on Google search
- Changes coming- Add Shopping to main page for more prominent listings
- FB will funnel to website refreshing content in real time



Judy Stelljes spoke about the changes at the Event Center. The building is still used as a Senior Center, but with recent updates including WIFI and projection, the facility is now suited to host events, parties and conferences. Capacity is 100. Call (707) 279-2175 to rent

The idea of Sip and Stroll is to bring folks into Kelseyville in March a typically quiet business month. The event is intended to be a mature type pub/sip crawl through the main street area with drinks and snacks offered at various businesses. Konocti Harbor is making a big comeback in our community. Russ Hamel was on hand to speak. Here are the highlights:

- Partial opening by Memorial Day with 100 Hotel rooms, marina, coffee shop and restaurant ready to go.
- This is a full renovation project planned in stages. The pool is being renovated with Cabana's to rent. Put Put Golf is coming back, an outdoor bar, full sports bar restaurant and indoor theatre is planned.
- What's not happening- no condo's or timeshares.
- The outdoor theatre is far in the future. The old concerts were not profitable, more of a service to the community that the plumber's union absorbed as a loss
- Up to 400 people will be employed when fully up and running.
- The construction project is using skilled craftsmen to train unskilled local workers which will elevate the work force in Lake County
- The Group expects to attract Boat Shows, Bass Tournaments and Wine Events with the 15 acres purchased and vines planted across the road from the existing site.
- The Group hopes to expand the road at the entry area to create a safer way to enter and exit the facility.
